### **Additional and Specific Anti-Bullying Supports**

- Mandatory Bullying Training for All Employees
- Guidance classes emphasize empathy and acceptance

- Health Class (8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup> grade) Social Health Unit includes bullying and cyber-bullying. Video, Bully-Proof.

### **Additional and Specific Anti-Suicide Supports**

- Health Class (8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup> grade) Mental health unit includes suicide. Students learn about personality, stress, coping strategies, mental health and depression. Video, on suicide, is watched.

**SAEBRS** screener - the Social, Academic, and Emotional Behavior Risk Screener is a brief and efficient tool to universally screen students at-risk for social-emotional and behavioral problems. Specifically, SAEBRS evaluates general behavior, social, emotional, and academic behaviors. The SAEBRS is designed for use across grades K-12. The reports provide teachers with information on whether individual students are at-risk for academic, social, and/or emotional behaviors. The group reports help identify trends that may need class-wide or school-wide intervention and support.
